PARKS AND CITY FARMS

There are lots of free places where you can take kids and bring your own food. Near to us, we love:
<u>Stepney City Farm</u> Visiting the farm is completely free and no need to book. You can meet the farm animals including ducks, sheep, goats, donkeys, rabbits and guinea pigs.

<u>The Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park</u> in Stratford has over 550 acres of parkland and waterways, so there are endless places to walk and explore for free. There's a <u>special explorer trail</u> for children and amazing play areas across the Park – with <u>Tumbling Bay</u> in the north of the Park and climbing walls, sand pits, an outdoor gym and more in the south of the Park.

GALLERIES AND MUSEUMS

At <u>Tate Britain</u>, in Pimlico, there are <u>play studios</u> for you and your children to make art together! Tate Modern, near London Bridge, has loads of spaces inside where kids can roam and explore, you can <u>interact with</u> <u>some of the art</u> and have a go on a <u>digital sketch pad</u>.

At the London Museum of The Docklands, you can explore the history of the London Docks and the people who have lived there. It's free to enter and there are lots of free family events, including <u>under 5s play sessions</u> and <u>quiet afternoons</u>, and loads of <u>special events</u>.

And right here in Bethnal Green: <u>The Young V&A</u> is a free, national museum all about the power of creativity in children's lives. There are <u>performances</u>, <u>storytelling</u>, <u>workshops</u> as well as toys old and new.

Every borough will have their own free lunch and holiday activities for kids. Here's what we have found on offer in <u>Hackney</u>, <u>Redbridge</u>, <u>Tower</u> <u>Hamlets</u> and <u>Islington</u>.





The <u>Money Saving expert website</u> has a whole host of ideas you can try, which is worth having a look at. We loved this <u>frozen</u> <u>dinosaur eggs idea</u>! And for active kids, if you shop at Aldi they have a special offer at the moment where you can <u>try a sport</u> for free.
